Project Summary

Game-Set-Match: Everything You Need to Know About the Sport of Tennis is an interactive experience in which users can learn about the sport of Tennis through interactive games, puzzles, images, and text.

Pages/Sections

1. *Introduction* – The first page will introduce and welcome visitors to the site. It will let the visitors know what to expect and what they're supposed to do. Once the visitors finish reading the brief introduction, they can click the button marked "Enter Court." This will take the visitor to a tennis court. It'll be an interactive environment using Flash and ActionScript 3.0. In this room, they'll be able to highlight and select various items that will open up the other pages/sections with new information about the sport of tennis.
2. *Rules* – Visitors activate this section by clicking on the rule book on the umpire's chair. This section will explain the rules of the game of tennis through use of scrollable text.
3. *Techniques* – Visitors activate this section by clicking on the tennis racket on the floor. This section will briefly describe common techniques used to hit the ball. Images and text will explain the techniques.
4. *Video Drills* – Visitors activate this section by clicking on the digital camera on the floor. This section will show a user how to practice some basic moves through use of video.
5. *Equipment* – Visitors activate this section by clicking the photograph on the floor. This section will discuss the equipment and gear commonly used in the sport. Users can complete a clothing drag-and-drop puzzle.
6. *Surfaces* - Visitors activate this section by clicking on the net pole. This section will discuss the various surfaces that tennis is played on like clay, cement, grass, and asphalt.
7. *Tournaments* - Visitors activate this section by clicking on the trophy. This section will discuss the various grand slam tournaments that pros compete in which include Wimbledon, The U.S. Open, and The French Open.

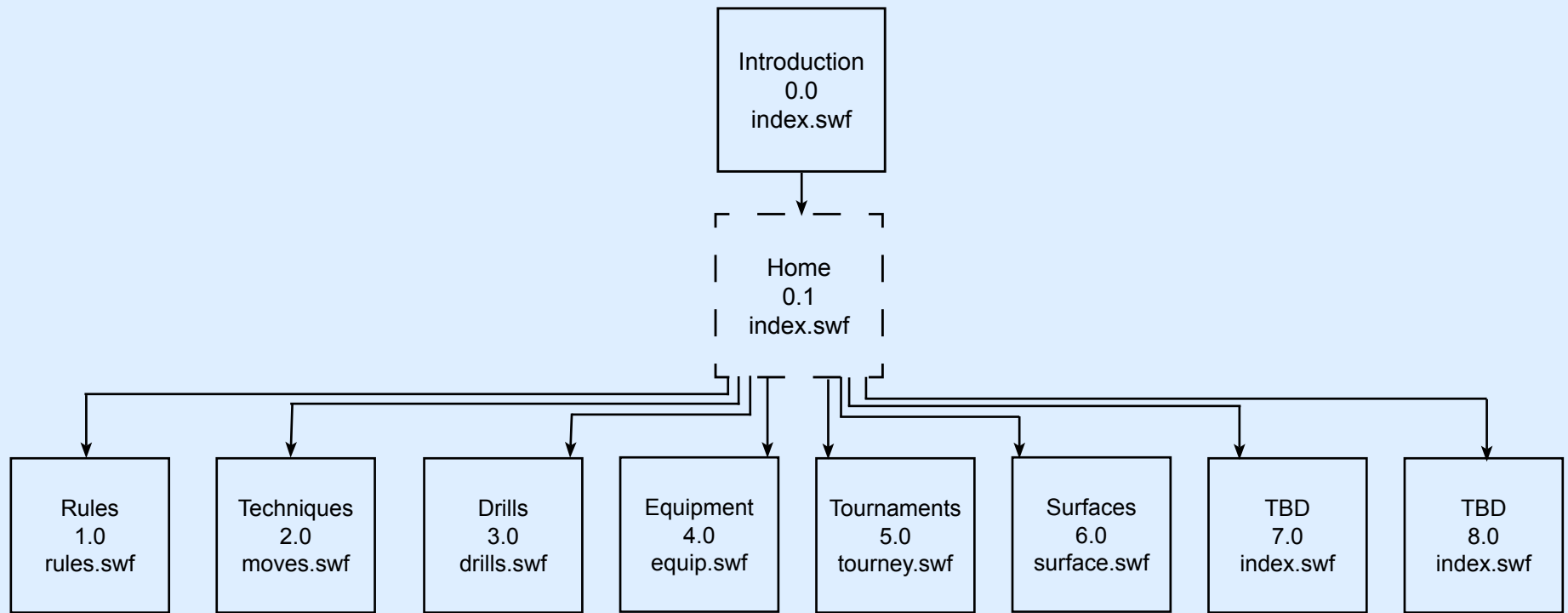
Audience

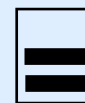

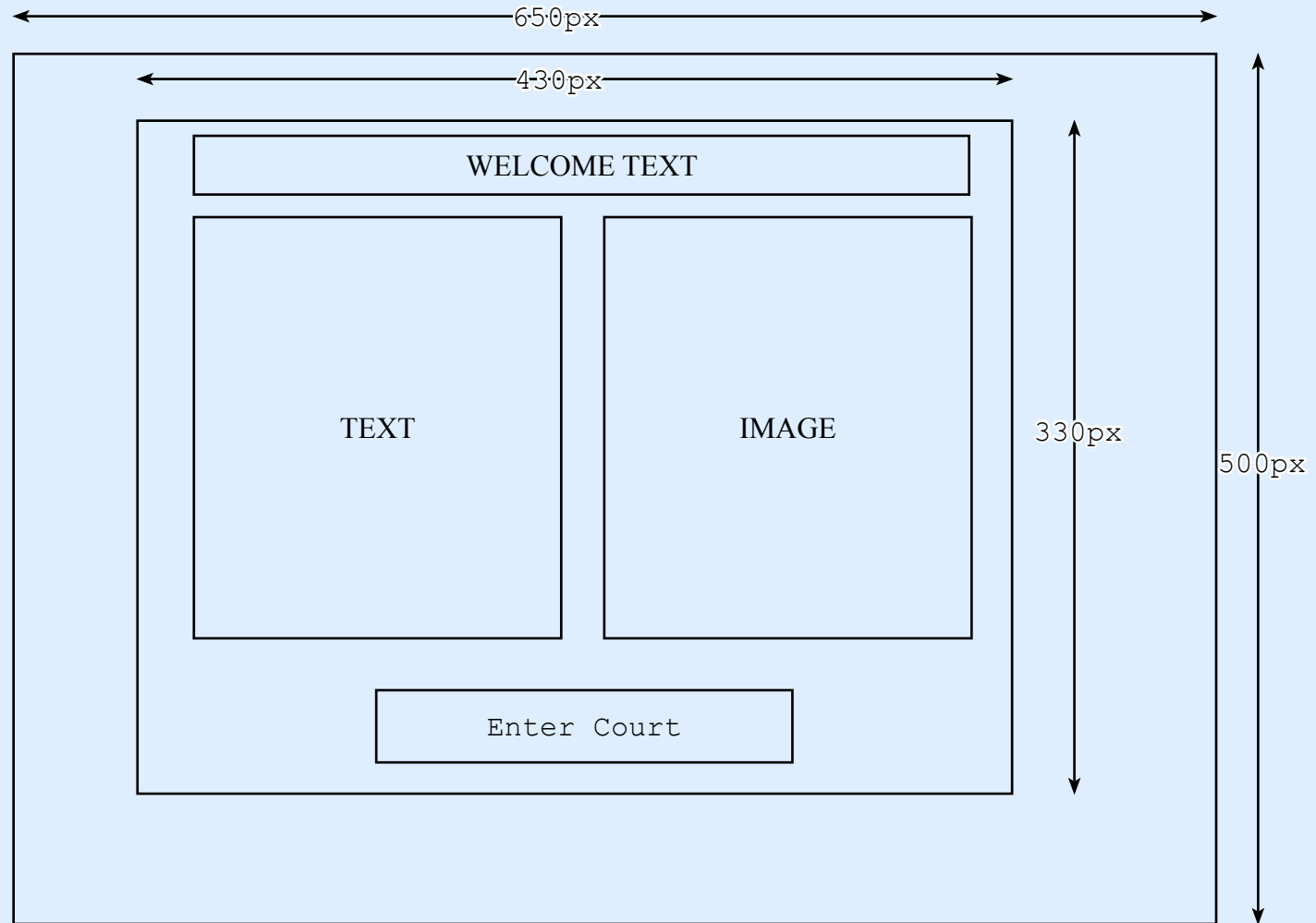

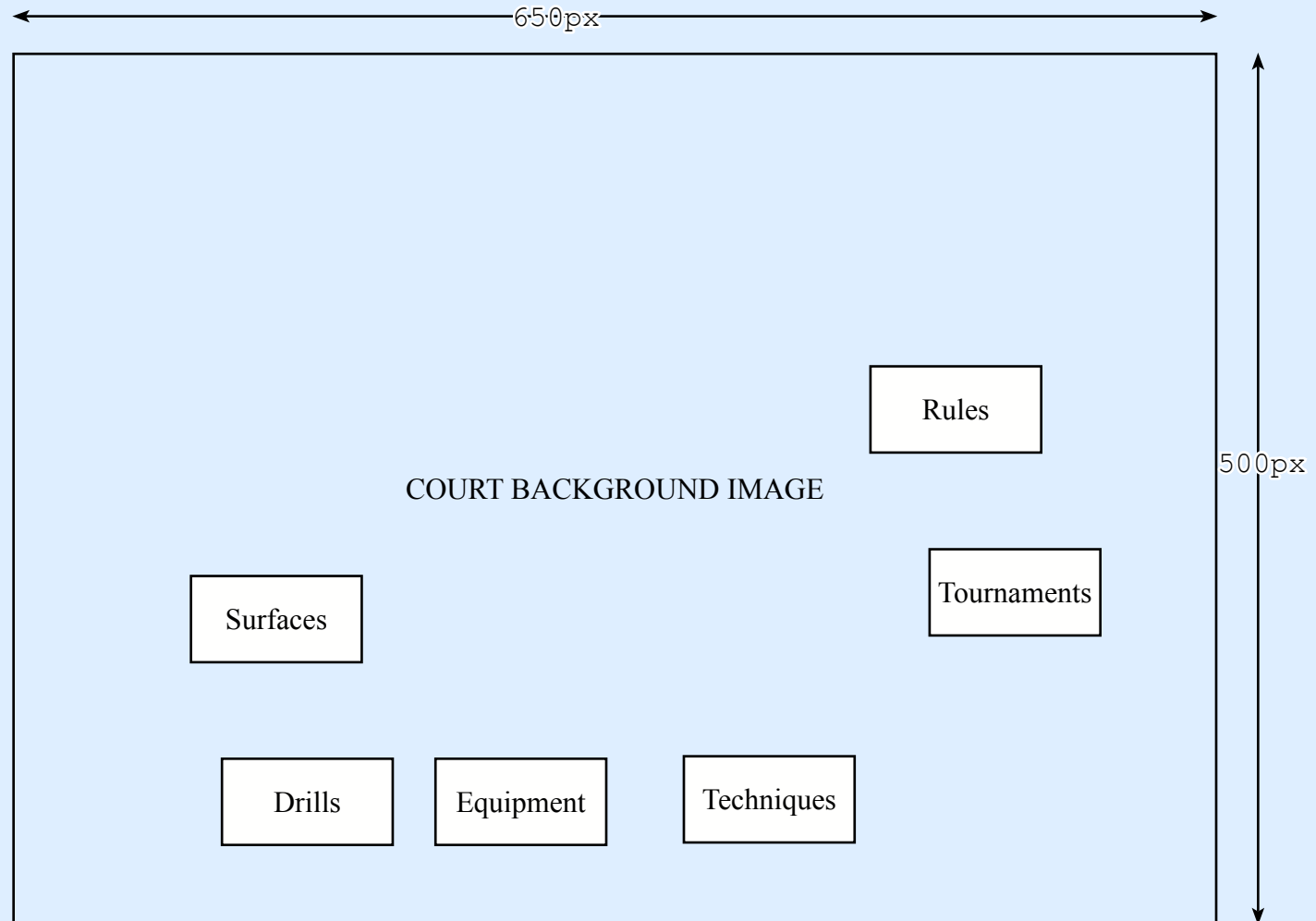
WIREFRAMES - INTRODUCTION

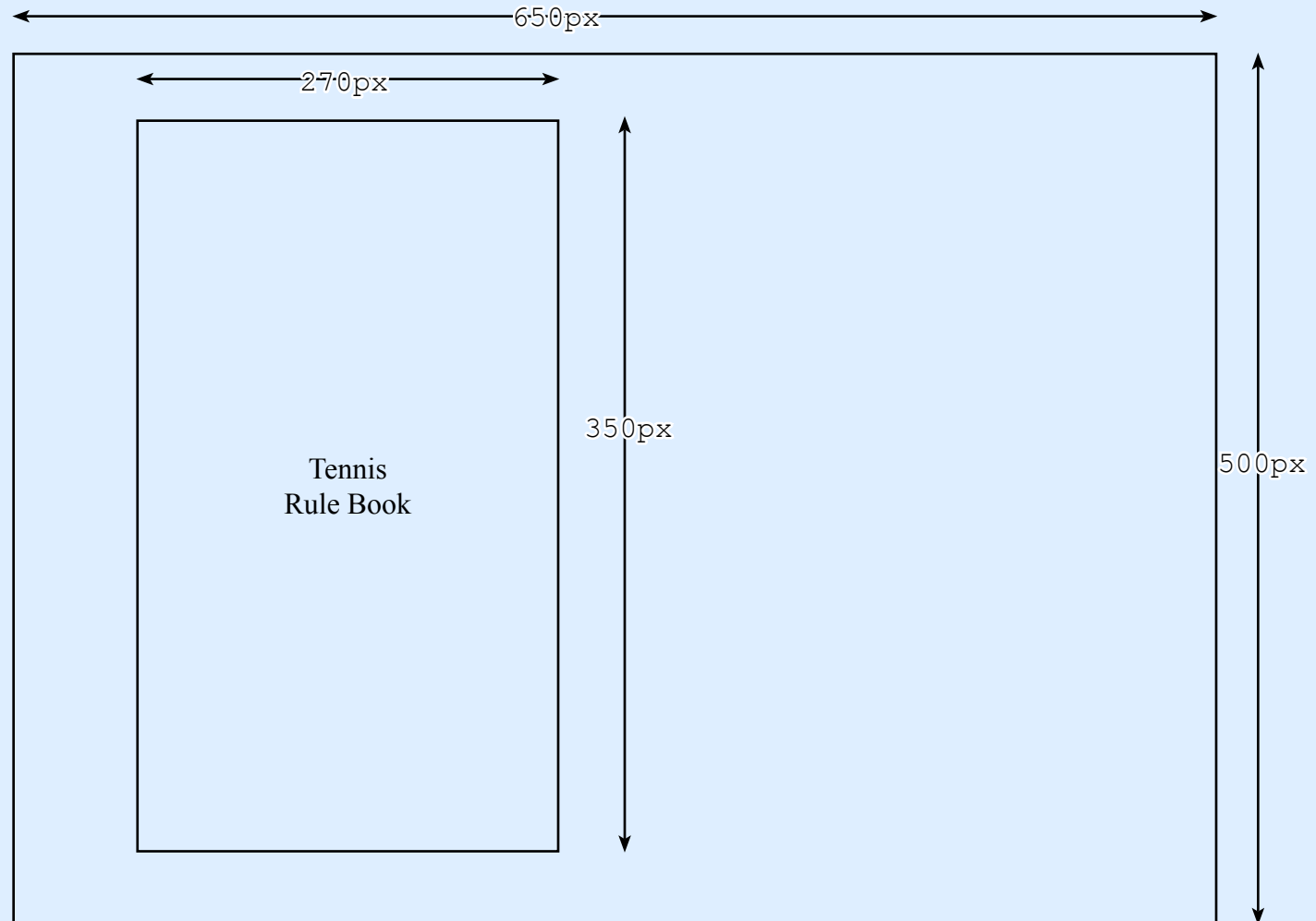
Visitor will be first greeted by this introductory page. Once visitor understands the concept of the site, the visitor can begin the exhibit by clicking the Enter Court button.

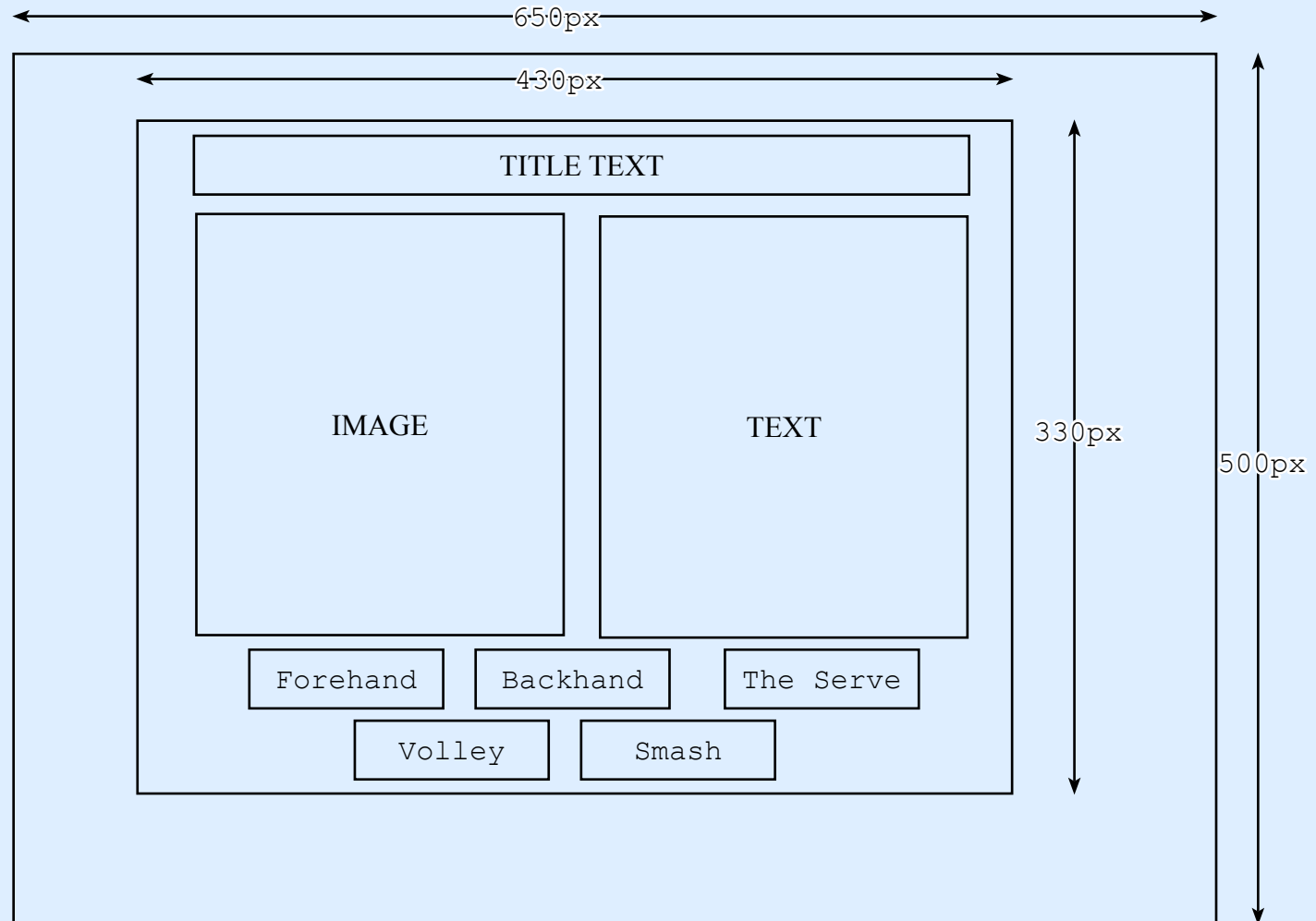

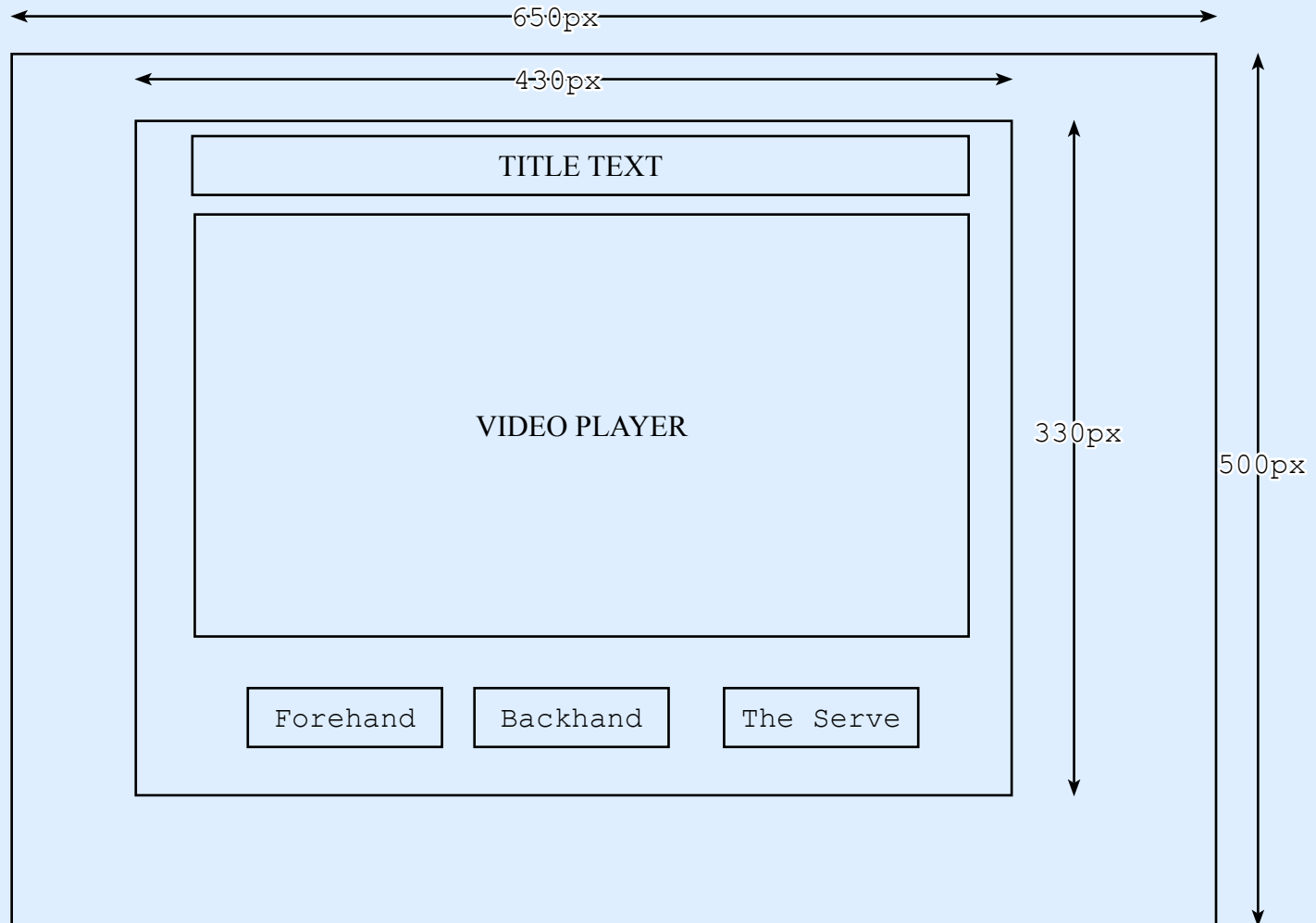

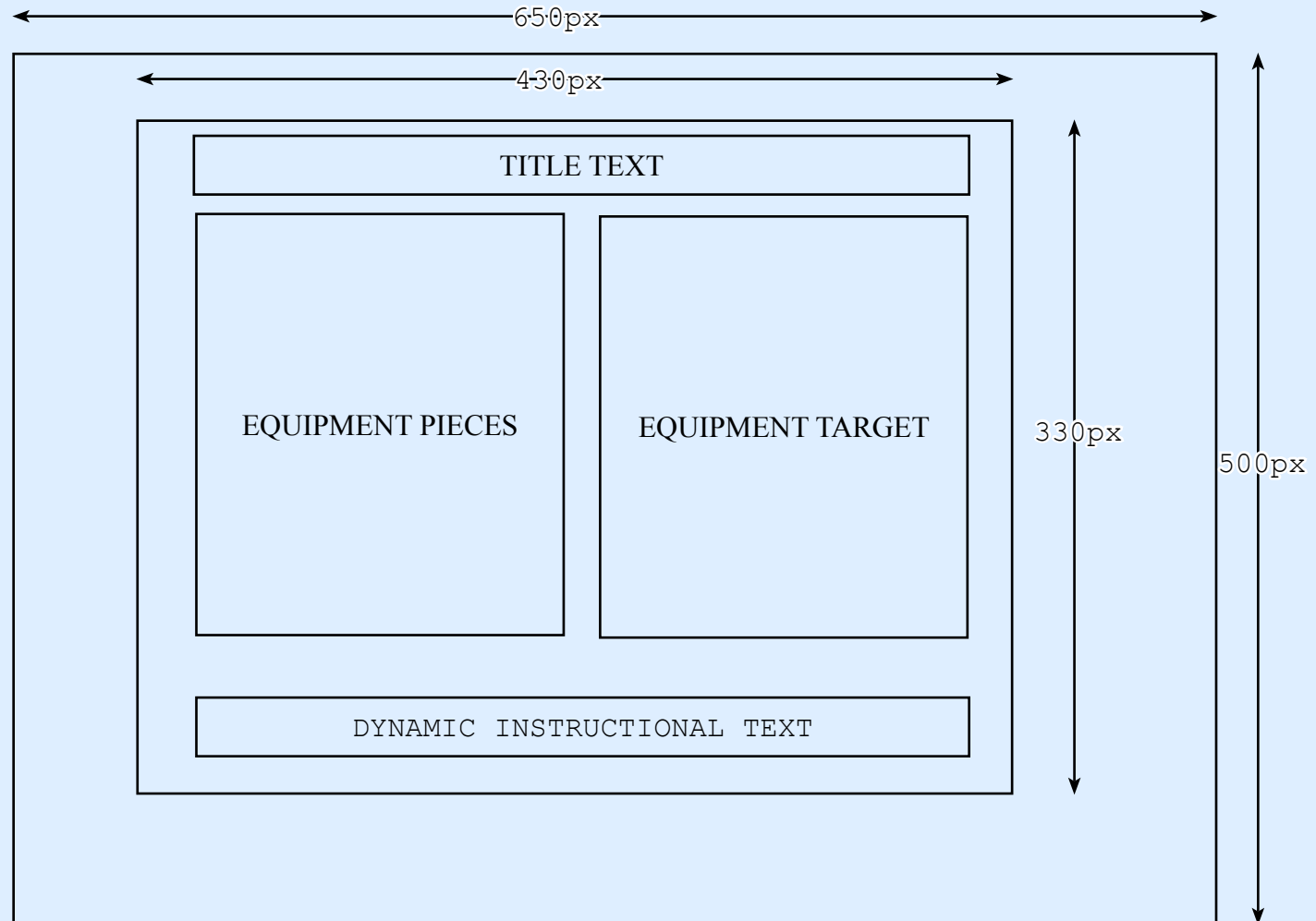
Visitor can see the different common techniques by clicking on the name of the technique.
